



LOOKING FOR Dogs with Skin Infections

CANINE RECURRENT PYODERMA (SKIN INFECTION) Staphylococcal lysate Study

Goal of the Study

To determine if a vaccine helps in management of skin infections thus eliminating the need for repeated courses of antibiotics

Who Qualifies

Dogs with recurring Staph skin infections may qualify pending an examination by our clinic.

What Happens

The patient is examined by one of our dermatologists to determine if it qualifies for the study. This exam includes skin swabs and blood tests. Patients are prescribed topical antimicrobials to treat the pyoderma (skin infection.) Patients are randomly assigned to receive either study vaccine or placebo (no medication) injections at home. (Client receives training on providing this treatment.) Injections are given two times per week along with the prescribed topicals. Patients also receive a medicated bath one time each week. The patient returns to our clinic every six weeks for a total of four visits.

Why Participate

If the patient qualifies, there is no charge for follow-up exams, medications or testing. The vaccine has the potential for improvement of long term skin infections. Patients are pioneers for a new treatment that may help thousands of dogs in the future.
